- Collaborate with the state cancer council



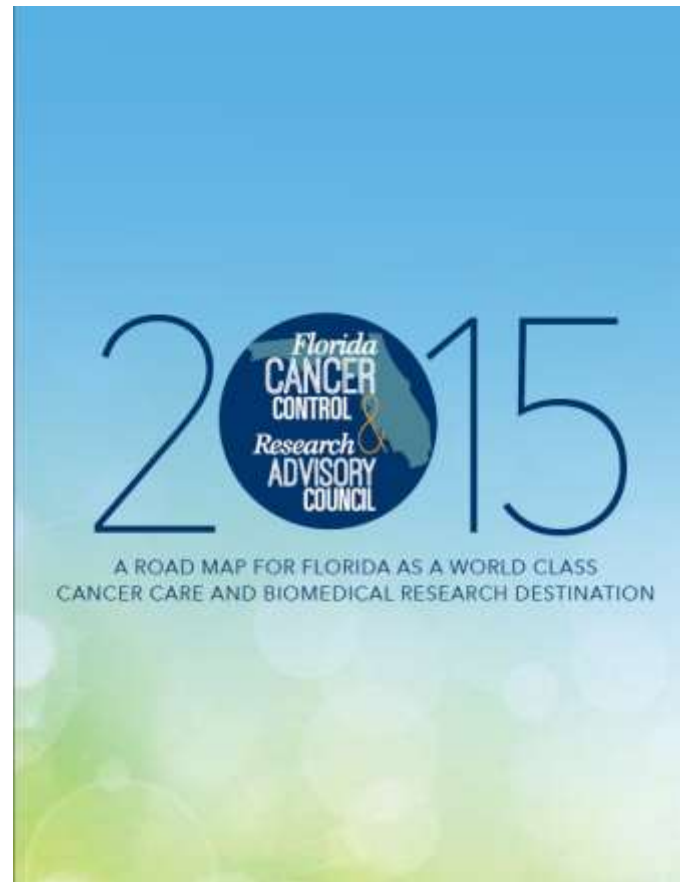
Florida Cancer Control and Research Advisory Council

Standard 3.3 Survivorship Care Plan

“The cancer committee develops and implements a process to disseminate a comprehensive care summary and follow-up plan to patients with cancer who are completing cancer treatment. The process is monitored, evaluated, and presented at least annually to the cancer committee and documented in minutes.”

Survivorship Care Plan (SCP) Purpose:

Monitor cancer reoccurrence or second cancer

Assess long-term and late effects

Manage follow up care

Ensure medical record for family

Institute of Medicine

Minimum Elements of a SCP

- Diagnostic tests performed and results.
- Tumor characteristics
- Dates of first and last treatment
- Surgery, chemotherapy, radiotherapy...
- Psychosocial, nutritional, & other supportive services
- Contact information on treating institutions and key point of contact

Past efforts

Worked with the cancer registry, the Florida Cancer Data System on a pilot project with Nemours Jacksonville

Conducted two surveys with the CoC cancer centers

Convened a Survivorship Taskforce

Current efforts

Pilot project with Strategic Health Intelligence, utilizing the Direct Hybrid Patient Look-Up Program

Develop a query mechanism to obtain data and create a survivorship care plan

Pilot sites: Pensacola and Orlando
